A Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

The first week of half term has flown by and we are back in the swing of things for our first week back. The children have also had the excitement of Halloween, discos and the impending Bonfire Night celebrations this coming weekend to contend with, yet have got back into the swing of things brilliantly well.

In classes, Nursery pupils have fallen head first into the themes of Halloween and Bonfire night. In Science, they have been melting ice balls full of 'eyeballs' and spiders, using their fine motor skills when using pipettes and water, picking spiders from webs and playing hammering golf! I was lucky enough to witness skeleton and pumpkin art taking place too. Children have also used the light box to make Halloween and Bonfire pictures

In Reception, children also followed a Halloween theme – They designed their own pumpkins, searched the outdoor area for pumpkin faces and then drew these. They explored pumpkins using scoops and spoons and have enjoyed sensory play for creating their own potions!

Year One pupils have been learning about partwhole models and have been writing number sentences in Maths. In Art, children have been using Lego to print with and create different patterns. In Year 2, pupils have been writing their own seasonal Acrostic poems. Ask your child what is special about acrostic poems!

Year 3, children have been looking at layers of soil, once more in an edible form! Obviously we don't advise eating the real thing! Children have also considered how Bronze was made and why the discovery was so important.

Year 4 have been finding soundproofing solutions for a Rock band in Science. They have also been comparing the Ancient Greek Olympics with those in the modern day as part of their learning in History.

Year 5 pupils have been learning about the slave trade in History and have been learning some animal names in French. See how many different animals your child can name in French!

Y6 went to IWM North and saw many real artefacts related to the first and second world wars. We spoke to ex-military personnel and people who were evacuated. We learnt so much! Thanks to all the adult helpers who came with us and made it possible for us to go.


Boo the Badger
