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A Message from the Headteacher

This little light of mine...

Dear Parents and Carers,

Another busy week in the life of a Woodie...see what your child has been up to this week, just in case they tell you they have done nothing or they can't remember. It has been a week filled full of light and colour!

Nursery children have been reading the book 'Whatever Next!' They have been thinking about baby bear packing for the moon, rocket building and making art rockets using 2D and 3D shapes to print with. They have also been singing space songs and playing percussion.

In Reception, children have been learning more about Diwali. They have looked at colours, patterns and textures whilst making rangoli patterns and have acted out the story of Rama and Sita.

Year 1 pupils have been finding out about the human body. They have made art straw skeletons in Science, they have learned about Diwali and have begun to write Autumn poems using their senses. In Maths, the children have thought of lots of ways of making 10 and in History have started to learn about toys from the past. What a busy week!

Year 2 children have continued to write their stories based on Little Red Riding Hood. They have also been looking at adding to the next 10 in Maths. In Art, different tools have been used to create different prints with paints on paper. This will be used to make collages with next week

Year 3 pupils have taken part in Science investigations looking at the permeability of different types of soil. They have also been enjoying lots of happy Christmas Carol singing.

Year 4 pupils enjoyed a visit from a real-life scientist — Dr. Tom Hawkins who held a hands-on workshop for the children to test their scientific investigative skills on sound and electricity. Dr. Hawkins was most impressed with Y4's enquiry skills and their scientific knowledge. Ask your child what their favourite activity was and can they tell you what a 'Theremin' is?

Year 5 children have been learning about the trade triangle and doing performance poetry, square, cube and prime numbers in Maths and creating poetry portraits with carbon paper.

Year 6 children have had a week of developing vital life-skills. They have learned how to perform life-saving CPR and have met a range of agencies that keep us safe at Crucial Crew. Then, not so vitally, they have classified licorice allsorts in Science. Naturally, I had to help the children test these to make sure they were ok to use in their lesson and I am pleased to tell you they were!

Across school, it never fails to impress me how much fun takes place whilst children are learning some very wonderful and important things too. Well done everyone!
