## Music Skills and Knowledge

Expected by the End of Year Six

## Play and Perform

Play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using their voices and playing musical instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression.

- Perform/sing solo with increased confidence and control.
- Sing in parts, 2 and 3 part rounds
- Make all performances as expressive as possible.
- Sing a broad range of songs, including those that involve syncopated rhythms, as part of a choir.
- Sing three and four part rounds.
- Engage with others through ensemble playing
- Learn the correct names for all note values from a semiquaver to a semibreve.
- If confident add compound rhythms.
- Sol-fa work (not compulsory) Soh me lah doh re doh' te fah


## Respond and Review

Listen with attention to detail and recall sounds with increasing aural memory

- Clap back a four bar rhythm pattern
- Sing and clap back a main theme from a listening exercise

Appreciate and understand a wide range of high quality live and recorded music drawn from different traditions and from great composers and musicians

- Write/talk about music, show understanding of the inter-related dimensions and make comparisons across genres.
- Make use of MMC listening examples
- Evaluate live music

Develop an understanding of the history of music

## Create and Compose

Improvise and compose music for a range of purposes using the interrelated dimensions of music

- Create a composition from a given or chosen stimulus that shows understanding of the inter-related dimensions of music.
- Extend improvisation skills to create music with multiple sections.
- Use chord changes in improvisation.
- Compose 8 or 16 beat melodic phrases using a pentatonic melody.
- Compose melodies in G major or E minor.
- Compose a ternary piece using available music software.


## Listening and applying knowledge and understanding

Use and understand staff and other musical notation

- Notate compositions using the most appropriate method applicable
- Capture and record creative ideas
- Notate your 8 or 16 bar melody
- Read and play from notation a four bar phrase, confidently identifying note names and durations.
