Since returning to school after Christmas, we have noticed some of our usual uniform requests and school rules being forgotten. Dear Parents and Carers,

After the snow came the rain – and LOTS of it! As the saying goes – it is lovely weather for ducks!

This week in classes, Nursery pupils have been discussing the language of position with penguin and umbrella. They have also been counting and playing with big dominoes, matching each end. They have also been learning why polar bears can't eat penguins (Maybe they can't get the wrappers off?) You can see a picture of Percy the Penguin visiting one of our nursery children at home this week at the top of this page! Children have also been learning to write their names!

Reception children have been looking at the stories of Percy the Park Keeper. They have been looking at lots of parks in the local area and using Google maps to try and locate them. The children have also been looking at mass and capacity in Maths and have been enjoying using maths resources to weigh different objects in the classroom!

Year 1 pupils have started retelling the story of The Princess and the Pea in English. In Maths, they have been using and creating their own number lines. In Geography, they have been spotting the differences between rural and urban areas. In Music, children have been listening and responding to Peter and the Wolf by Prokofiev.

Year 2 pupils have been counting money and making different amounts – such an important skill in our contactless world! They have also been writing about the Great Fire of London.

A Message from the Headteacher

...Stormy weather...

Year 3 children have been learning to use millimetres, centimetres and metres in maths. They have also made their own papyrus paper and created thumbnail Egyptian designs in their sketchbooks. Children have asked questions and explored the use of mirrors in Science with a final touch of drama work exploring emotions through the book 'Egyptian Cinderella'. What a busy week!

Year 4 pupils compared human teeth to those of different animals in Science and were able to explain the different type of teeth and their uses. In Maths, there has been lots of multiplying by 10 and 100. The children have also made great progress in swimming – Well done everyone!

Year 5 children have been writing character descriptions in English, reasoning with 3 digit and 4 digit numbers multiplied by 2 digit numbers in Maths and have been enjoying more djembe djembe drumming in Music.

In Year 6, pupils have completed their short stories in English. They have investigated heart rates in Science, tackled algebra in Maths and made prints in Art using their own symbolic designs.

This week in assembly, we shared the story of Vanessa Nakate – a young, female activist on climate control. Ask your child what they remember about the story. She is someone I knew nothing about until we read her story together – An inspirational young lady indeed!
