A Message from the Headteacher

Spring has Sprung!

Dear Parents and Carers,

Our first week back has flown by as we begin the second half of Spring term. It is always my favourite time in the school year because we get to see the children grow so much – academically and physically! In fact, some people have come back to school with much longer legs than they finished last half term with!

In classes, Nursery children have been looking at the book 'Dear Zoo'. The children have been performing actions of the adjectives describing the animals, making animal faces with natural loose parts, weighing different animals, making their own lift the flap books and using animal patterns in their paintings. Some beautiful nursery art work is at the top of this page.

Reception pupils have been learning about measure in maths and have enjoyed measuring objects in the classroom. Children have also been writing stories using tales toolkit about nursery rhyme characters. Children have also been doing some wonderful gymnastics balances in P.E.

Year 1 children have been looking at historical artefacts trying to work out what the item is. In Maths, children have been looking at number bonds to 20. In English, they have created their own stories based on a picture. Year 2 pupils have enjoyed performance poetry based on the Brian Moses poem 'Walking with my Iguana'. They have also been learning facts about iguanas ready for English next week.

Year 3 children have started writing their own Egyptian Cinderella stories. They have begun to create Egyptian dances in P.E and have been looking at floods in Geography – and conveniently we have some large puddles around the year 3 classrooms that help us with that very topic! Children have also completed their work on length and perimeter in Maths too.

Year 4 pupils have been practicing their front crawl in swimming. In English, children have been working hard on writing non-chronological reports on animals.

Year 5 children have been learning about budgeting, pollution and drawing techniques. In English, pupils have looked at writing a persuasive letter to the prime minister about plastic pollution.

Year 6 pupils have been thinking about inherited characteristics in science and finding the hidden meanings in allegories in English, in history we have started to find out about what happened in the village of Eyam.

This week has been a wet one so let's hope that next week we see a little more sunshine to dry up all the rain! Have a lovely weekend. **Boo the Badger**
