# A Message from the Headteacher

## It's a question of time...

**Dear Parents and Carers** 

Another busy couple of weeks for us – so much so that this newsletter has doubled up over two weeks!

I have spoken to the children about how many of you read the newsletter and I have set them the challenge of asking you to ask them the questions I pose on here about their learning.

In Nursery, our children have been making their own mini habitats which will be displayed in the hall for the whole school to see. We are all very excited to share nursery's work.

In Reception, pupils have been looking at the stories of Percy the Park Keeper and The Invisible String as part of their learning. Ask your child what activities they did this week to bring their learning to life.

In Year 1, pupils have been learning about bigger and smaller numbers – more than and less than. Ask your child why crocodiles only eat larger numbers and hopefully they'll be able to help you make the connection between crocodiles and numbers! In Year 2, pupils have been looking at different artists and their styles – look up Yayoi Kasuma and you will be able to discuss the art work your child has been looking at using dots to make shapes and pictures.

In Year 3, pupils have been discussing the different Egyptians Pharaoh's there were and placing them into timelines. Ask your child to name as many Pharaoh's as they can!

In Year 4, pupils have been thinking about their bodies and digestive systems. They have labelled the parts and will be able to tell you soon enough exactly how the food you eats travels from the moment it goes into your mouth until it reaches its final destination – just a word of advice, it may be best not to discuss this at mealtimes!

They have also been talking about the River Nile and the gifts it offered. Ask your child what these gifts are.

In Year 5, pupils have been looking at Roman Numerals in Maths and Viking Battle moves too. I also walked in on a Science lesson about a chocolate teapot – you may need to ask your child why this is a bad idea!

Year 6 are busy brushing up on their times tables and other maths skills not to mention polishing and perfecting their writing too – keep up the good work everyone! \*\*POLITE REQUEST\*\* British Science Week is coming up after the holiday. This runs from 10<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup> March and the theme is Connections. If any of our parents or wider community know of STEM volunteer speakers who may be willing to give a talk or presentation to some of our children, please let the school office know and they will put you in touch with Mrs Bennett, our Science Subject Leader.
