## A Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

What a wonderful first week back for our Woodies family. I have been quite taken with how many growth spurts have taken place over the Whit holidays – so many children look like their legs have grown significantly longer and they are noticeably taller than they were two weeks ago – It must be all that sun that's helped then to grow!

In Nursery, children have been thinking about things that live under the sea. They have used the story of Tiddler to help them. It has also been an important time to talk about keeping safe in the sun!

In Reception, the children have enjoyed settling back into school this week and have shared all sorts of stories and news about what they got up to in the holidays.

Year 1 pupils have been starting to look at stories from other cultures. Ask your child what they can remember about this.

Year 2 pupils have begun their topic on the Titanic. They have put themselves in the shoes of the Captain and written their own Captain's log about the start of their maiden voyage.

Year 3 pupils have been learning about deforestation and growing their knowledge about both sides of the debate. Ask them what the two sides are and what their feelings are surrounding this.

Year 4 children have been learning about the changing states of water and the water cycle. They have made mini water worlds with cress seeds, compost and water, sealed with cling film to see all of the processes in action — evaporation, condensation, precipitation... There is even a song! Ask your child to sing this to you and see what they have learned.

As part of their topic 'Is it out of this world?' Year 5 pupils watched a live streamed lesson from the Royal Observatory, Greenwich on Tuesday all about space from one of their STEM scientist.

Year 6 took part in a session a few weeks ago with John Lewis who came in to help them design mood boards and create their own art work.

This has now been judged and prizes awarded. All of the artwork will be displayed in the workshop area of John Lewis, Cheadle from 19<sup>th</sup>- 29<sup>th</sup> June. Anyone is welcome to go and have a look.
