## A Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

It is a common misconception that schools 'wind down' at this time of year. This couldn't be further from the truth! In fact, as the school year rolls towards its conclusion, we still have so much to learn and so much to do. There are 431 reports to write, proof read and send out; there are 80 new little people and their families who are currently preparing for starting in September...60 of those in Reception and 20 in Nursery, and so information packs are being busily put together and sent out to make sure they start their Woodies journey off on the right foot. We also prepare to say goodbye to 60 more children from our Year 6 and wish them well as they move to high school. Finally we have the small job of regrouping the rest of the school and forming new classes for the new school year. We always consult all of our children during this process to ensure that their thoughts and wishes are taken into account too. So, it is all very busy and exciting everywhere you look in school, whilst still finishing off the end of year curriculum!

Over the last two weeks, Nursery pupils have been continuing to learn about under the sea creatures. They have also been learning about mermaids and are getting ready for their visits to Reception, ready for next year.

In Reception, the children have been learning lots of facts about dinosaurs. They have also been making their very own clay models of dinosaurs too.

In Year 1, children have been learning about the history of the car and talking about Karl and Bertha Benz. They have also been writing their own newspaper report and learning about money.

In Year 2, the children have been learning statistics in Maths. Meanwhile in English, children have been writing their own acrostic poems as part of their topic on the Titanic.

Year 3 pupils enjoyed a visit to RHS Bridgewater. I was lucky enough to join them for some of the day and thoroughly enjoyed the children engaging with nature, looking at the different gardens and themes and using lots of their curriculum knowledge to identify shapes, different soil types and so much more.

Year 4 pupils have taken inspiration in art from the rainforest. They have made mood boards using swatches and colour palettes. They have used oil pastels to create art work of plants and tropical fruits.

In Year 5, pupils have enjoyed their trip to Jodrell Bank to support their learning in their 'Out of this World' topic.

Our Year 6 pupils have had the best time on their recent residential to PGL in Shropshire. Lots of fears were overcome, new skills learned and team bonding took place which is so special with just four weeks left together before they go their separate ways. Since returning, rehearsals are busily taking place for Grease to bring together the upper juniors end of year performance.

And alongside ALL of the above, every class has taken part in an African Dance workshop as part of our P.E enrichment – not bad for the end of year 'wind-down', is it?
