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SEND Updates

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to inform you about upcoming changes to our universal offer, SEND provision and paperwork at Warren Wood.

What is our universal offer?

Universal provision at Warren Wood is the supportive tools and adjustments we provide for all children to be able to access the curriculum so they achieve their full potential. It is the responsibility of all teachers and staff within school to make learning and the environment as accessible and inclusive as possible for all learners through Quality First Teaching.

What is Quality First Teaching?

Quality First Teaching emphasises high quality, inclusive teaching for all pupils in a class.

What is adaptive teaching?

Adaptive teaching, relates to the adaptations made to teaching to ensure all learners are provided with the opportunity to meet expectations. It encompasses the importance of effective planning prior to the lesson, as well as the adjustments made to teaching and learning throughout the lesson. The term is inclusive and recognises the distinct and separate needs of every pupil in the classroom.

Adaptive teaching moves away from the idea of labelling individuals and groups according to their ability and is centred around the idea that teachers have high expectations for every pupil in their care. All learners will experience the same high expectations set out by the teacher, with differing layers of support eg resources, adult support, visuals, technology, to help them make good progress and achieve well over time.

All teachers and teaching assistants have received training on adaptive teaching in line with Stockport's training policy.

What is a SEND register?

The Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) register is a list of pupils who have been identified as having special educational needs or a disability, who need some additional help at school, beyond that of Quality First Teaching and above our universal offer. Children stay on the SEND register as long as they need additional support. For some pupils, this may only be for a short while, for others this may be more long term.















What is a SEND Plan?

Our SEND register covers the four areas of SEND as stated in the SEND Code of Practice (2015). These are Cognition and Learning, Communication and Interaction, Sensory and Physical, and Social and Mental Well-being. Outcomes are agreed, additional support is put in place, outcomes evaluated and new outcomes set if appropriate. All SEND Plans include 'SMART' outcomes. These are Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic, and Time-bound which supports children in making progress.

What will be changing?

From September 2023, our universal offer, within our graduated approach to SEND, will be expanding. This means we will be supporting more children through inclusive practices and adaptive teaching. Some children currently on our SEND register (targeted), may be supported with a 1Page Profile, and/or Quality First Teaching (universal). The diagrams below shows this very well.
