

Dear Parents and Carers

So, our first full week of being in school is over. It has been very much 'business as usual' balanced with the normal settling in period for all children. Whilst school has the same rules and expectations throughout, we know that for all children, getting used to a new teacher, new classrooms and new friends can take time for them to settle into the swing of things.

Our Nursery pupils joined us this week. They have been getting to know each other, learning how to play and share in their learning and they have all made birthday crowns.

In Reception, our pupils have completed their first full week together too. They have been exploring their emotions through the story of 'The Colour Monster' and, like Nursey, the children have been learning how our classrooms work.

Year 1 children have been sharing their knowledge of animals. In English, they have been writing about the jobs that a zoo keeper may have to do. They have also been talking about the months of the year and seasons. Year 2 have completed a timeline of flight as part of their work in History.

Year 3 pupils have been reading the book 'How to wash a Wooly Mammoth' and have used their senses to explore rocks.

Year 4 children have conducted a sound survey around school measuring sound in decibels using data loggers. They have also enjoyed their class guided reading lessons, reading Mr. Penguin and the lost treasure. They were also judges in a performance poetry contest and voted Michael Rosen's 'The Torch' as their favourite.

Year 5 pupils have had a guest speaker in school to talk to them about their time living in Africa. This will form part of their understanding as they embrace the key question in their learning 'Who has the power?'

Year 6 pupils have been immersed in the work of war artists, looking at the tension that led to World War II and propaganda.

A busy start to term but we just love being back and learning together!


Boo the Badger
