Dear Parents and Carers,

As this half term draws to a close, we have felt a real sense of togetherness for a variety of reasons.

In September, some of our Woodies found it a little tricky to get back into the swing of things. We have always prided ourselves on the behaviour and conduct of our pupils and so we have worked together to make sure that this has been at the forefront of our minds. As the term has moved on, I am pleased to say that we have ended the term in a more positive way, showing strength in the way we are behaving and supporting one another. We are definitely viewing good behaviour as our superpower and it has been wonderful to see it in action!

We have also been mindful of how many challenges many of our families are still facing. Our Harvest festival served as a timely reminder that life closer to home is tough at the moment and so our school family came together as only they can – ensuring that this holiday is a little easier for them. In classes, Nursery pupils have been thinking about their houses, which rooms are in them and what technology is in each room. They have also been performing digit dances to learn formation.

In Reception, children have been looking at the story 'Giraffes Can't Dance'. Children have been drawing pictures of the things that they are good at and something they would like to get better at, just like the giraffe in the story. They have also been learning how to draw a giraffe. In Year 1, children have been looking for signs of Autumn, using tools in the forest to cut down sticks and finding out about harvest time and how it is celebrated.

In Year 2, pupils have been making a chair for baby bear, trying out lots of different ways to make it stable so that it is 'just right'.

Year 3 pupils had a crumbly creative day building Stonehenge out of biscuits – there appears to be a theme here...I wonder if Mr.Parkes and Mrs. Cowie love biscuits? They have also been writing accounts of Stone Age day last week.

Year 4 children have learnt how sound travels and have made string telephones in Science. In History they have learned about Greek Gods.

Year 5 pupils have had a Humanist speaker in to visit them, have compared life cycles in Science and have written a description of an African waterhole scene. They also sent a team to an athletics competition and the Y5/6 boys and girls won an interschool cross country event at Marple Hall. Year 6 pupils played a football match in the cup and won that too!

Y6 have been performing harrowing war poetry. I was lucky enough to see one of these performances – the empathy and heart that went into it gave me goosebumps! Children have also been making periscopes using their knowledge of the law of reflection.

Boo the Badger


