Writing <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Write some short phrases based on familiar topics and begin to use connectives/conjunctions and the negative form where appropriate. EG: My name, where I live and my age. Writing frames should be used.	Reading <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Read aloud short pieces of text applying knowledge learnt from 'Phonics Phonics & Pronunciation Lessons 1 & 2'.- Understand most of what we read in the foreign language when it is based on familiar language.
Basic Grammar <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Better understand the concept of gender and which articles to use for meaning (EG: 'the', 'a' or 'some').- Introduce simple adjectival agreement (EG: adjectival agreement when describing nationality), the negative form and possessive adjectives. EG: 'In my pencil case I have...' or 'In my pencil case I do not have...'	



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
