Despite a few wobbles in settling back after our long and relaxed start to the new year, we have all enjoyed being back together and learning new things. We have also noticed lots of our little people have had growth spurts over the holiday – either that or they got a pair of longer legs for Christmas!

Tis week, Nursery children pupils have been trying to find out if anyone has lost a penguin! They have asked the birds in the trees, the ladies in the office and the big ship but no one has lost a pengin! They have found out how penguins keep warm by conducting their very own science experiment using ice. They have also been talking about friendships and feelings and how they have lots of friends at school including 4 new children who have started nursery this week – Welcome to our Woodies family everyone!

Year 3 pupils have written Winter Kenning poems, have been learning the 8 times table and have asked questions about their new History focus on Ancient Egypt. They have also welcomed back Miss McCabe from her maternity leave!

Year 4 children went swimming with school for the first time this week. They have also been discussing what they would like to find out about their new History focus of The Romans. In Science, they have started to learn about the digestive system and in R.E they had a visitor to talk to them about Christianity

Year 5 pupils have started their work on the Anglo Saxons in preparation for their Viking visitor next week. In P.H.S.E, they have been learning about British law and held a mock trial. They have also been learning Pilates and how to play African djembe drums.

Year 6 children have been proposing the repurposing of a ballistic missile in English, tackling ratio in Maths and beginning a new Science topic with an introduction to dissection – Not something I envy at all but am completely bowled over by their high levels of engagement and maturity.

In assemblies this year, I will continue to focus on stories of inspirational people from all backgrounds, abilities, races, religions and genders.
