This week, Nursery children have been demonstrating good ball skills. They have also shown what amazing listening skills they have and have been learning to put their coats on too!

In Reception, pupils have had an amazing first full week and have completed a self-portrait each. We all do one of these each year to see how we change over time and how our skills improve the older we get!

In Year 1, children have loved music and have liked learning about dynamics. Ask your child what this means in musical terms!

In Year 2, pupils have been writing about 'Bog Baby' in English. They have also been learning about the Wright Brothers in History. Ask your child what they were famous for?

Year 3 children have been learning about the Stone Age. They have been discussing 'assets and threats' and how this related to life during the Stone Age.

Year 4 pupils have used xylophones and recorders and looked at how ears work and how pitch changes in Science – Mr. Parkes reports that he is still not over this cacophony of noise! They have also used different number lines in Maths.

Year 5 pupils have continued to impress at swimming. In English they have been thinking critically about the role of European countries.

Year 6 pupils have moved onto addition and subtraction in Maths.

Mr. Cooke has been busy preparing the school sports teams for the year ahead. The girls' football team have their first match today – GOOD LUCK to them!

Mr. Parkes class - Y4


His message though is
