Dear Parents and Carers

This week, Nursery children have been making their very own version of Elmer the Elephant. They have been celebrating all of our differences and have used different materials to make him. They have also enjoyed Autumn walks and found acorns and leaves.

In Reception, pupils have been learning about their feelings. They have read the book 'The Colour Monster', have started to learn phonics and have learned the sounds 's' and 'a'.

In Year 1, children are learning about adjectives and how to use them. In Maths, they are counting backwards and finding one less.

In Year 2, pupils are learning all about different types of materials in Science. Mr Fisher reports that he is still having the best fun in Year 2 with the new children.

In Year 3, children have been learning about rocks and fossils. They are doing a fossil hunt using chocolate chips and cookies!

By using toothpicks to pick the chocolate chips out of cookies, they will be doing what paleontologists did when they found fossils and dinosaur bones!

Year 4 pupils have learned about Alexander the Great in History and why he was so great! In Maths, the children are learning about Roman Numerals and in Science they have been making string telephones.

**&**

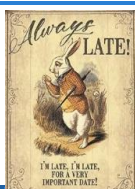
**Mr. Toye's class – Y5**
