Another week jam packed with learning has flown by and the weekend is nearly upon us. Let's look at what we have all been busy doing.

This week, Nursery children have been making beds for Mr. and Mrs. Bear. When asked what they liked about Nursery, one child told us that they liked playing with the toys with their friends. They have also talked about the technology they use at home. Thank you to the mums, dads and other grown-ups who have sent photos in of this!

In Reception, pupils have been learning about other peoples families and thinking about the people in their own families. They have also read the book 'Elmer'.

In Year 1, children have started to write independent stories based on the book 'Old Bear'.

In Year 2, pupils have been writing instructions and learning all about Bessie Coleman – ask your children why she is famous! (picture clue at the top of the page to help)

Year 3 children have been working hard to apply number bonds to 10. In indoor P.E, they did gymnastics and are stopping into shape jumps using point and patch balances. In English they are designing traps to catch the 'iron man'.

Year 4 pupils have been rounding numbers. In History they are looking at Greek gods and goddesses. In PSHE they have discussed bullying.
